DECK LAYOUT

The deck arrangement on "Early Riser" assists easy transitioning fore and aft. The wide side decks allow exterior bow and stern access from the pilothouse doors. Port and starboard rails extend the entire length of the side decks for added security while transitioning. The $1\frac{1}{4}$ " upper salon top rails provide solid grab rail integrity. The windlass is operated from the pilothouse or the foredeck. Access to the anchor locker is on the bow through the hatch for easy inspection. The cockpit provides access to the upper salon top via a ladder on the starboard side. Storage beneath the cockpit is immense and accessed through separate lazarette hatches. The large swim platform is accessible through the offset boarding gate to the starboard side with a telescoping swim ladder to assist water ingress and egress. The upper holds the hard bottom inflatable and crane davit to port. When the dinghy is launched, the salon top is a great area for sunbathing, lounging and harbor watching. A great deck layout stem to stern.


INTERIOR LAYOUT

The focal point of the American Tug 41 "Early Riser" is without a doubt the Pilot House. The dedicated Stidd helm chair, commanding views forward and the settee with table ultimately is where most of the gathering occurs. The 41 floorplan is perfect for two couples with the ability to sleep up to two in the convertible settee in the main salon. The center helm and console provide the perfect vantage point to safely pilot "Early Riser". Quick and easy access to the sliding pilot house doors is steps away from the helm. Ventilated windows are forward of the PH doors, hatch and two aft facing windows looking across the upper salon top Moving down the companionways five steps forward and to starboard is the master and quest staterooms. The master stateroom further down its own companionway reveals a comfortable athwartship berth. A full hanging locker forward provides ample hanging wardrobe space. The dedicated head with separate shower stall is large with abundant storage above counter and below. The guest stateroom forward in the bow features an offset to port queen berth. The adjoining head with separate shower stall also offers ample storage above and below counter. Moving aft from the pilothouse are four stairs leading to the main salon and galley. The U-shaped galley is found on the port side. Large solid surface counter space extends forward from the double bowl sink aft sweeping right to the stove top forward. The separate fridge and freezer are adjacent to the stove with the microwave directly above.

The main salon consists of a long L-shaped settee to starboard that converts to a large double berth. The large soldi surface dinette table easily seats four for a meal. The opposing barrel chair engages conversation with those seated at the dinette. The seven panoramic windows in the salon, four of which open for ventilation and have privacy and darkening shades including the cockpit hinged door. The American Tug 41 floorplan has room to stretch out, move around delivering a comfortable platform underway or at rest.
